Call for abstracts

We are interested to hear about your work on supportive care in children with cancer. This may include a piece of research, an audit or quality improvement project conducted locally. This is your opportunity to share your work with our community of healthcare professionals who care for children and young people. The deadline for submission is 17:00 on Friday 9 May 2025.

We use the following definition:

Supportive care helps the patient and their family to cope with their condition and treatment of it – from pre-diagnosis, through the process of diagnosis and treatment, to cure, continuing illness or death and into bereavement. It helps the patient to maximise the benefits of treatment and to live as well as possible with the effects of the disease.

If you would like to submit an abstract for consideration, please follow the instructions below.

Abstract Guidelines

Layout

The abstract should be typed in English, using Times New Roman 12 point font and should fit on a single side of A4. The abstract must include the TITLE in capital letters. The authors should be named on the line below (not in capitals). Do not use the full postal address of your institution, just the hospital/institution (and department if relevant) and the city. The remainder of the abstract must fit in the box.

Construction

The abstract should be no more than 250 words. Do not include any tables or references. Where you can, it is best to lay the abstract out using the following headings:

- (a) background
- (b) aims
- (c) methods
- (d) results/findings
- (e) implications

Submission

The deadline for submission is **17:00 on Friday 9 May 2025**. All submissions are to be sent as an attachment in Microsoft Word format to events@cclg.org.uk. The covering email should be submitted by the presenting author and include their name, job title and institution.

Acceptance

Notification of acceptance for presentation will be sent by email. All accepted abstracts will be reproduced for the delegate pack. Oral presentations will be allocated 5-10 minutes (maximum of 10 slides). There will be a prize awarded to the best presentation.
